(Because of dietary restrictions, please do not include any candy or food unless it is specifically requested.)

Prayer of the Day

God of justice and peace, from the heavens you rain down mercy and kindness, that all on earth may stand in awe and wonder before your marvelous deeds. Raise our heads in expectation, that we may yearn for the coming day of your Son, Jesus Christ, who gives us the pattern for how we shall live in the meantime. In your holy name, **Amen.**

Lighting of the first Advent candle

Reader: We enter this season of waiting, by lighting this first candle, anticipating the light of the star that shone over Bethlehem for all to see. (candle is lit)

Reader: Advent God, we open ourselves to hear your call today to become those who not only wait, but also work, for peace in our lives, our families, our communities, and our world.

First Reading: Isaiah 64:1-4

This lament comes from a people who have had their hopes shattered. The visions of a rebuilt Jerusalem and a renewed people of God, spoken of in Isaiah 40–55, have not been realized. Instead, the people experience ruin, conflict, and famine. This lament calls God to account—to be the God who has brought deliverance in the past.

O that you would tear open the heavens and come down, so that the mountains would quake at your presence—

as when fire kindles brushwood and the fire causes water to boil—

to make your name known to your adversaries, so that the nations might tremble at your presence!

When you did awesome deeds that we did not expect, you came down, the mountains quaked at your presence.

From ages past no one has heard,

no ear has perceived, no eye has seen any God besides you, who works for those who wait for God.

PSALM: Psalm 80:1-7, 17-19

Let your face shine upon us, and we shall be saved. (Ps. 80:7)

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 1:3-9

As the Christians in Corinth await the advent of Jesus, Paul reminds them how the Lord has already enriched them through spiritual gifts and will continue to strengthen them until the coming day of the Lord.

³Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

⁴I give thanks to my God always for you because of the grace of God that has been given you in Christ Jesus, ⁵ for in every way you have been enriched in him, in speech and knowledge of every kind—⁶ just as the testimony of Christ has been strengthened among you—⁷ so that you are not lacking in any spiritual gift as you wait for the revealing of our Lord Jesus Christ. ⁸ He will also strengthen you to the end, so that you may be blameless on the day of our Lord Jesus Christ. ⁹ God is faithful; by him you were called into the fellowship of his Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

Gospel: Mark 13:24-37

In today's reading, Jesus encourages his followers to look forward to the day when he returns in power and glory to end all suffering.

²⁴ 'But in those days, after that suffering, the sun will be darkened,

and the moon will not give its light,

²⁵ and the stars will be falling from heaven, and the powers in the heavens will be shaken.

- ²⁶Then they will see "the Son of Man coming in clouds" with great power and glory. ²⁷Then he will send out the angels, and gather the elect from the four winds, from the ends of the earth to the ends of heaven.
- ²⁸ 'From the fig tree learn its lesson: as soon as its branch becomes tender and puts forth its leaves, you know that summer is near. ²⁹So also, when you see these things taking place, you know that the One is near, at the very gates. ³⁰Truly I tell you, this generation will not pass away until all these things have taken place. ³¹Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away.
- ³² 'But about that day or hour no one knows, neither the angels in heaven, nor the Human One, but only God in heaven. ³³Beware, keep alert, for you do not know when the time will come. ³⁴It is like a person going on a journey, when they leave home and puts their servants in charge, each with their work, and commands the doorkeeper to be on the watch. ³⁵Therefore, keep awake—for you do not know when the overseer of the house will come, in the evening, or at midnight, or at cockcrow, or at dawn, ³⁶or else the overseer may find you asleep when they come suddenly. ³⁷And what I say to you I say to all: Keep awake.'

Pastor Charis' Message

We made it to Advent, y'all! It feels like a joyful milestone, and yet with the ongoing pandemic that continues to worsen, the feelings of despair can creep in like a houseguest that has overstayed their welcome.

The first Sunday of Advent in the lectionary always has an emphasis on the return of Jesus. Because of this, Advent has both a backward look (anticipating the first coming of Jesus), as well as a forward look (anticipating the second coming of Jesus). It's like time is all muddled up, and we find ourselves in this odd space of a present that is both a gift and a hardship, with a faith that looks both forward and backward. *Discombobulating* might be an appropriate word.

My suggestion is to lean into this strange time. Acknowledge the grief. Acknowledge the gift of a Savior who continues to come to us. Acknowledge that even though we're not together, we are together. Truths that appear to be in opposition can both still be true. It's kind of like Jesus being both God and human. It's kind of life our faith that turns death to life.

As a chaplain I saw grief and joy go hand-in-hand. It changed me. Maybe we'll find some unexpected changes in us this Advent, that births something good in us and in this congregation. Who knows? We can live in to the possibilities, as we wait for a pregnant Mary to give birth, as we wait for a risen Jesus to come back again.
